ENTRIES/FEEES:

ONE HORSE PER ENTRY FORM, PLEASE!

Copy of each horse's MFTHBA registration must accompany each entry form.

For registration postmarked/received by July 13: \$10/class/rider. \$50 unlimited youth rider; no charge for beginner youth classes. Beginner youth who wish to enter youth classes will pay \$10/class/rider or \$50 unlimited. Youth/beginner youth who wish to enter amateur classes will pay \$10 per amateur class (in addition to any entry fees for youth classes).

For registration received after July 13 or registration made at the show: \$15 per class; \$60 unlimited youth rider.

If entering at the show, please fill out all forms completely before you reach the entry desk (to make the process more efficient for everyone). You will receive a list of classes entered and fees paid at the entry desk. Please verify your entries and fees before leaving the entry desk.

All entry fees, stall fees and RV fees must be prepaid before you will be allowed to show.

Stall fees: \$20 per day per stall for the duration of the shows. Stall fees must be prepaid with entry. Stalls will be available starting on Wednesday, July 16. If you need to arrive before July 16, please call Mark Woolley (801-694-8469) **before** arriving on the grounds to make special arrangements. Fairgrounds management will not unlock stalls without show management direction.

RV Hookups: \$25 per night per site charge to use camping electrical and water hookups; fees begin on the day you arrive. RV fees must be prepaid with entry. Sites are first come, first serve. Restrooms and shower are available on the grounds. No grounds fee for day use or non-hookup camping.

ENTRY DESK HOURS: Entry desk hours to be determined. Please watch your e-mail and the UFTHA website (www.uftha.com) for more details. **Registrations and class additions will only be accepted during posted hours – no exceptions.** Registrations received or class changes made after July 13 (including at the show) will be subject to late fees.

AMATEUR RIDER STATUS: All amateur riders must present a current MFTHBA Amateur card at registration to be eligible for amateur classes. Amateurs may enter amateur or open classes, except in versatility division. Youth entering amateur classes must have an amateur card.

INTERMOUNTAIN VERSATILITY CIRCUIT: The Great Western Show is part of the 2009 Intermountain Versatility Circuit which includes the Big Sky Foxtrotter Show in Montana and the Big Horn Basin Foxtrotter Show in Wyoming. See the MFTHBA website for official circuit rules.

CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES: There will be no additional entry fee for championship classes. Rider/horse teams which qualify for more than one championship class may not ride in a championship in more than one division (amateur, open, youth, novice).

BEGINNER YOUTH RIDERS: All beginner youth classes are limited to novice and beginner youth riders, age 17 and under as of Jan. 1, 2009. Any youth who has shown in the youth division prior to 2009 is not eligible to show in the beginner youth division. For 2009, any youth who has won a beginner youth high point award in any previous year is not eligible to show in the beginner youth division. There is no charge for beginner youth classes; beginner youth may also show in youth classes but must pay the youth class fees.

YOUTH RIDERS: Youth is defined as age 17 or under as of Jan. 1, 2009.

NOVICE ADULT RIDERS: Novice adult riders may not have won more than a combination of 3 first through third placings in non-novice fox trotting classes during any calendar year. For novice versatility, the exhibitor must not have won more than a combination of 3 first through third placings for a specific versatility class during any calendar year.

Novice Adult riders who also wish to compete in Amateur classes must have an amateur card.

REGIONAL/NATIONAL HIGH POINT CLASSES: Placements received in classes marked with an “ X “ will count toward regional/national high point awards.

GREAT WESTERN HIGH POINT AWARDS:

Ranch Horse Champion
Amateur High Point Versatility
Open High Point Versatility
Youth High Point Versatility
Beginner Youth High Point
Novice Adult High Point

RANCH HORSE COMPETITION:

Open, Amateur and Youth exhibitors will compete concurrently against each other.

To be recognized as Ranch Horse Champion, an exhibitor must compete in at least 4 ranch horse classes, one of which must be Ranch Pleasure.

There will be a one-time cattle fee of \$40 to enter any of the ranch horse cattle classes (roping, cutting, working cow).

Placement points will be awarded in each of the 6 Ranch Horse classes as shown on page 71 of the MFTHBA 2006 Rulebook, with the exhibitor receiving the highest point total designated as Ranch Horse Champion.

Points accumulated in the Ranch Horse competition will not count toward the versatility high point awards.

RULES: This show will be run in accordance with the 2006 MFTHBA Official Rules, Standards and Policies book (including any subsequent changes approved by MFTHBA). All participants should be familiar with the rules as printed in the MFTHBA Official Rules, Standards and Policies book. It is participants' responsibility to be in compliance with the rules for the classes in which they are competing.

Classes may be canceled or combined at the discretion of show management.

For the safety of spectators and participants, dogs must be leashed at all times. Thank you.

CLASS NOTES:

Hunter Hack: Open, Amateur and Youth riders will compete together for 5 placements. For the purposes of Versatility high point awards, points will be awarded according to division. Points earned in Hunter Hack do not count toward Versatility Circuit awards.



GREAT WESTERN CHALLENGE

Eligibility: Horses may have been shown in other competitions. A sufficient number of nominations must be received by July 13, 2009 or fees will be refunded. Any age 3 and up Missouri Fox Trotter of any gender, registered with the MFTHBA, may participate. First place horse/rider teams are eligible only one year. If horse is sold it will be eligible with the new owner and/or trainer.

Divisions: Amateur and Open.

Classes: Amateur Western Pleasure/Open Western Pleasure, Amateur Trail/Open Trail, Ranch Horse Conformation, Ranch Horse Working Cow, Amateur Barrel Race/Open Barrel Race. Each horse must show in all 5 classes in its division. Classes to be held during the 2009 Great Western Show held at Farmington, Utah.

Judges: to be judged by the 2009 Great Western judges using the MFTHBA 3-judge system.

Entry Fees: \$200 plus \$50 class entry fees.

Payback: Entry fees and any added money less expenses will be paid back as follows: first: 70%; second: 20%; third: 10%.

GREAT WESTERN FUTURITY

Futurity classes will be held at the 2009 Great Western Show and are open to any MFTHBA registered Fox Trotter. Nomination fee will be \$100 (\$75 to be paid out in the class entered, with \$25 retained by UFTHA for class entry fee and administrative fee), WITH THE FOLLOWING EXCEPTION: MFTHBA registered offspring resulting from winning bids at the 2005-2008 UFTHA Stallion Showcase are eligible for futurity through 3-year old year for a \$50 nomination fee (plus \$10.00 entry fee and \$5.00 office fee, as well as any late fees and stall fees)

Classes: Futurity classes will be as follows:

1. Model Yearling Filly
2. Model Yearling Colt/Gelding
3. Model 2-year old Filly
4. Model 2-year Old Colt/Gelding
5. 3-year Old Performance 2-gait
6. Senior Performance 2-gait (4 years and older)

Payout: Payout will include \$75 of nomination fee, paid out in class entered; plus any added sponsorship money designated for the Futurity; plus 50% of net proceeds from 2009 Stallion Showcase auction, to be apportioned equally between the 6 futurity classes.

1. 1 entry: 1st Place: 100% of purse
2. 2 entries: 1st Place: 60% of purse; 2nd Place: 40% of purse
3. 3 entries: 1st Place: 40% of purse; 2nd Place: 33% of purse; 3rd Place: 27% of purse
4. 4 or more entries: 1st Place: 33% of purse; 2nd Place: 27% of purse; 3rd Place: 22% of purse; 4th Place: 18% of purse.

Future Eligibility: The winning horse of the 2009 Senior Performance 2-gait Futurity class will be ineligible to enter the Senior Performance 2-gait Futurity class in 2010 with the same registered owner.

Deadlines: All horses must be nominated for the Futurity and paid in full by July 15, 2009. No refunds are allowed after this time.

Registration Papers: All entrants for Futurity must have original MFTHBA papers available for inspection.

All judges' decisions are final.

2009 MFTHBA Versatility Circuit Championship

Mission statement

The MFTHBA Circuit Championship competition is intended to develop awareness and encourage participation in the Versatility Program, both at the Regional and National level. This is done by discovering and recognizing the hard work and talent of horse and rider teams at the Regional levels and offering them the opportunity for national recognition and eligibility in the National Circuit Competition at the annual MFTHBA Show and Celebration. All affiliates are encouraged to step up and join the fun!

Versatility Circuit Rules

FORMAT

- 1) The 2009 Versatility Circuit eligibility season will commence on October 1, 2008 and will end September 1, 2009. The 2009 Versatility Circuit Season will end with the National Versatility Circuit Championship competition during the 2009 MFTHBA Annual Show & Celebration.
- 2) Each circuit must be comprised of a minimum of three shows or a maximum of five. All circuits mentioned are REGIONAL circuits unless specifically addressed as the NATIONAL Circuit. There will be no cost to the affiliates for inclusion in this program. Regional Circuit awards must be procured by and will be at the discretion of the Regional Circuit management.
- 3) Application for Regional Circuit Show status must be made through an Affiliate chapter. Affiliates must apply to the MFTHBA Ava office to 1) qualify as a Circuit show and 2) be approved as a National Point Show. The name of the Regional Circuit Manager and Circuit Scorekeeper must be included in the application. Regional Circuit Show applications will be approved and coordinated through the MFTHBA office and the Versatility Committee. We encourage inter-affiliate cooperation in forming a Circuit. However, if an affiliate is not able to create a Circuit on their own, the Versatility Committee will place them with a Circuit, if it is geographically feasible.
- 4) It is encouraged that each circuit show offer a full slate of official Versatility classes, i.e. as delineated in the official rule book in all three Divisions (Open, Amateur and Youth). Show management may combine division classes when necessary and select fewer classes with the restriction that they must include the following mandatory eight classes: Western Pleasure, English Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, Showmanship, Trail, Reining, Barrels and Poles. All other Versatility Classes, as delineated in the official rule book, may be considered for optional classes, whose points will count toward the regional championship.
- 5) All Circuit show rules must be based upon Versatility rules in the current MFTHBA rule book. These rules pertain to all Circuit situations and must be strictly enforced.
- 6) Each Regional Circuit must appoint a Regional Circuit point keeper to keep a record of the points for all the

Versatility Circuit participants for each Regional Circuit show. The point keepers should not be competitors nor have immediate family members who are competitors. Each show within a Regional Circuit is required to use the same point system. For uniformity, we recommend that the point system be based on the number of entries in the class, but with a maximum of 10 points allowed for first place even if there are 11 or more entries. Example: If there are 10 horses in a class, 1st place receives 10 points, 2nd 9 points, 10th receives 1 point. If there are less than 10 entries in a class, the points awarded reflect that number, i.e. if there are 6 horses, 1st place receives 6 points, 2nd 5 points and so on. We recommend awarding points to at least 10 places when there are ten or more entries. When it is necessary to combine division classes, all entries must be placed for record keeping purposes. Points will be awarded based on the number of entries in each respective Division in each class. Points for the National Circuit Championship at the annual Show and Celebration will be tabulated according to the Versatility section of the MFTHBA Rule book.

7) The Regional Circuit score keepers must send the Versatility Circuit point results from each show to the MFTHBA office within two weeks after the show. Any show held during the month of August must send in their points prior to September 1, 2009. Results may be published on the website for competitors to check on their circuit status and will be published in the MFTHBA Journal.

8) The top four competitors in each Division of their Regional Circuit will be eligible to compete for the National Versatility Circuit Award in their Division at the annual MFTHBA Show and Celebration.

9) Competitors who qualify for the National Circuit Competition may compete in any or all of the Versatility classes at the annual MFTHBA Show and Celebration. Only the points earned at the MFTHBA Annual Show and Celebration will be tallied to determine the 2009 MFTHBA National Circuit Versatility Champion for each Division. Points earned at the Regional Circuit shows will be tallied to determine eligibility to enter the National Circuit competition and to determine the Regional Circuit winners.

ELIGIBILITY

1) All riders and horse owners must be MFTHBA members in good standing. Membership in the National organization must be effective before the date of the horse and rider's first circuit competition.

2) Competitors must ride a registered MFTHBA horse, 3 years of age or older. Competitors may ride more than one horse in the competitions, but only horse and rider teams will be considered for the circuit high point awards, not the individual rider or horse. Only one rider per horse will be considered for any Circuit awards. Horse and rider teams may not change Divisions after their application has been received. If it is necessary for a competitor to change horses, a new application must be completed and any points accrued will not be carried over to the new horse.

3) Each competitor may compete in only one Division (Open, Amateur or Youth). Amateur competitors must have an Amateur card.

4) Competitors must make application prior to the first Versatility class of the first Regional Circuit show they attend. Competitor records and points will be maintained by the Regional Circuit scorekeepers who shall be appointed by the show committees of the Circuit shows. Application forms will be available through the MFTHBA website or may be obtained from the MFTHBA office or at your Regional Circuit show.

5) The top four competitors from each Division of each Regional Circuit who have met the eligibility requirements and desire to compete at the MFTHBA Annual Show and Celebration for the National Versatility Circuit Championship must make application to the MFTHBA office before the first Versatility class of the

AWARDS

1) Regional Circuit awards must be procured by and will be at the discretion of the Regional Circuit Management. They may request that Regional Circuit Champions be acknowledged at the MFTHBA annual Show and Celebration with the presentation of awards procured by the Regional Circuit management. Requests for recognition must be received by the MFTHBA office prior to August 1, 2009. Regional Circuit awards may also be presented at the last regional Circuit competition.

2) National Versatility Circuit Awards will be presented to the Champion and Reserve high point earners in each Division at the 2009 MFTHBA Show and Celebration. Awards for the National Versatility Circuit High Point Champions will be procured by the Versatility Committee members and volunteers through sponsorships.
